



Loan Horse Guidelines for Owners¹

EITP is again inviting interstate and overseas riders to participate in this prestigious event. We are asking WA horse owners to support this great event by making their horses available for these interstate/overseas riders to compete on if possible. A limited number of these interstate/overseas based riders will be invitational. Outlined below is some information for owners loaning horses to invitational riders.

What qualifications will my horse need?

Any horse will need to meet the qualifications set out in the entry schedule to be eligible to compete. Please refer to Global Entries online for full qualification details.

If my horse wins a prize, who gets to keep the prize?

All prizes won will be awarded by EITP to the competitor only. EITP take no responsibility for any division or arrangement of prizes between the competitor and the horse owner.

Will I be paid for the use of my horse?

Owners of horses selected to be ridden at the event (one horse per invitational rider) will be paid \$400 by EITP for the use of their horse. A fuel allowance will also be available for horses having to travel > 100km from the Perth CBD, this will be approved on a pro-rata basis by the EITP Committee. Should you be travelling to attend the event, EITP will also facilitate accommodation for yourself and your horse for the night prior and night of the event. Owners of a loan horse will also be provided with with two (2) tickets to the McInerney Ford Lounge inc. Grandstand seating (valued at \$230) as a thank you for supporting our great event.

How long will my horse need to be available for?

Competitors may choose to travel to WA up to a week prior to the start of the competition and it would be appreciated if owners are willing to allow their rider the opportunity to ride the horse in the days leading up to the competition. Again, this is to be arranged privately between the competitor and horse owner.

¹ Please note that these guidelines relate to owners who are loaning a horse to invitational riders only. Any other loan horse agreements are at the discretion of the owner and rider and the EITP committee accept no responsibility for these arrangements.



If the loan horse is located outside Perth metro area (more than 60 km from Perth CBD), EITP will arrange suitable accommodation (free of charge) for the loan horse in the Perth metro area for the period of time that the invitational rider is in WA.

Who pays for the entry fee?

EITP cover one full entry fee for an invitational rider. If the invitational rider wishes to ride multiple horses then the entry fee will need to be covered by either the rider or owner, the second ride for the invitational rider falls outside these guidelines and EITP accepts no responsibility for these arrangements.

Who will ride my Horse?

Horses will be placed in a pool and allocated to invitational riders on a random selection basis. Invitational riders and owners are welcome to make their own private arrangements, however please note these agreements fall outside the guidelines above and EITP accepts no responsibility for these arrangements.
